### What Year is the Best Chevy 350 Engine?

Now that we've discussed the basics about the 350 Chevy engine you may be wondering, what year is the best Chevy 350 engine? While there may be some room for debate among Chevy fans, we feel that there are a few iterations of this engine that stand out:

## LT-1 – 1970

When the LT-1 hit the scene in 1970, it took the world by storm. This beast offered chart-topping power that Chevy actually had to reign in to make their models street legal. The 1970 Corvette churned out an incredible 370 hp with this V8 under the hood. The carburetor featured a one-of-a-kind aluminum intake that could reach 780 cubic feet per minute. No matter where you were headed in 1970, the LT-1 helped you arrive in style.

## L98 – 1992

Another fan favorite is the 1992 L98 350 engine. This rendition of the Chevy 350 Crate Engine managed to retain power, performance, and reliability, while also offering a level of fuel efficiency never seen before. This beast featured a TPI system and aluminum cylinder heads, helping it reach up to 230 hp.

## L31 – 2002

Last but not least, the 2002 L31 350 Chevy engine deserves recognition. This version was known publicly as the Vortec 5700 and was used in GM trucks and vans until 2002. However, design teams referred to it as the L31, and this name has been adopted by fans as well. Notably, this engine featured cylinder heads that were paired with combustion chambers and intake ports that were similar to the LT-1 350 engine.
